## CLASS DESCRIPTIONS: Winter Quarter (1/12/26 – 3/16/26)

Classes that do not meet the minimum enrollment will be cancelled.

### 1on1 Sports: After-School Soccer (2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 10/Max 18)

Join One on One this semester for After School Soccer. Skilled and experienced instructors will conduct an exciting and progressive session each week right after school. We will learn age-appropriate fundamentals, rules and strategies of the beautiful game, and have fun scrimmaging while focusing on teamwork, sportsmanship, and FUN!

### BEAM Experiences: Dungeon Master Academy (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 8/Max 14)

Learn to be a Dungeon Master and forge your own adventure! In this inclusive class about creative storytelling, kids won't just be playing D&D as an adventurer, they will build magical worlds, draw amazing maps, and weave fantastic stories to bring their campaigns to life. We will practice improv techniques, and learn the rules of D&D so that students can lead their own adventures. Then, working in groups, we will create characters and take turns running games for each other. At the end of the course, kids will take home custom adventure kits to share with friends and family!

### Bricks4Kidz: Lego Robotics Creative Contraptions (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 8/Max 12)

Let your imagination run wild with marvelous machines! In this class for inventive kids, we will explore fun new ways to build autonomous gadgets using sensors and motors, and discuss how real-world robots make industries function. Students will design and create original robotic arms, paper airplane launchers, catapults and more. Then, using everything we have learned, we will construct a collaborative mega-ball-mover! Note - this is an engineering and building class that does not have a focus on programming.

### Coding NP (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 5/Max 16)

Creative Coding teaches your child to code by helping them make their own custom video games! Our Project based, multi-level classes are amazingly fun yet very effective in teaching creative problem solving AND emotional resilience. As the students bring their ideas to life, they iterate through the emotional cycle of Coding (idea>excitement>effort> frustration>more effort>triumph!) With our support and positive encouragement. Repeating this cycle not only builds great coders, but more importantly, develops emotional persistence that will help students enjoy taking on new challenges in all aspects of their lives. Students new to coding will participate in the Creative Coding core curriculum, learning the fundamental elements of coding using MIT's Scratch to create their very own computer games! Many parents and educators are realizing that the benefits of learning to code at a young age extend far beyond the skill itself. Through the "brain exercise" of coding, coders build intelligence like athletes build muscles. Just as importantly, they develop stronger problem-solving skills, confidence over technology, and emotional persistence.

### Everlove Academy: Public Speaking, Debate, & Leadership (2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 5/Max 15)

Students will develop confidence, clear communication, and leadership skills through engaging public speaking and debate activities. In a supportive environment, they will practice organizing their thoughts, speaking with poise, and listening respectfully to others. Each class includes interactive exercises such as speeches, storytelling, improvisation, teamwork challenges, and mini debates designed to make learning both fun and impactful.

### Kids Carpentry Seattle (2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 5/Max 8)

Kids' Carpentry is a hands-on toy building experience designed to teach kids practical woodworking skills with an emphasis on the safe use of hand tools. While kids construct fun and exciting projects, they are also empowered to become independent thinkers--building confidence, self-esteem, and a repertoire of practical skills that will last them a lifetime. At the end of the session kids will bring home one or more wooden games or toys that they have built by hand from scratch.

### Kong Academy: Ninja Adventure Games (2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 10/Max 15)

Kong Academy's Ninja Adventure Games program blends active play and structured challenges to help kids build confidence, focus, and emotional awareness. Students will work together through stealth missions, movement games, and partner activities to strengthen perseverance, self-control, and goal-setting skills. They'll stretch their bodies and minds as they navigate obstacles, practice teamwork, and reflect on their progress. The goal is to move, grow, connect, and have fun along the way.

### Little Hands: Machine Sewing Winter Wearables (2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 3/Max 16)

Welcome to LHC's Machine Sewing class, designed specifically for students, 1st grade and up! Whether you're brand new to machine sewing or already have experience, this camp is designed to cater to all skill levels. All students will have a full safety overview of essential machine safety protocols, after which new students will complete our beginner sewing curriculum, while the more experienced students can build off their existing skills, taking their sewing abilities to the next level. This class is student-led, and they advance at their own pace with autonomy over the projects they choose to create. Projects include backpacks, phone cases, clothing, accessories, bags, games, stuffed animals and are swapped out every session! This is our most popular and most inclusive class where creativity knows no bounds! *\*For all new sewers, the first class of the camp is mandatory; please contact Chelsea Cook if your child is unable to attend.*

### Math N Stuff: Pokémon Trainers Club

(2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 8/Max 24)

Pokémon is a card game in which two players take on the role of Pokémon trainers, attempting to outwit and outplay each other using different Pokémon creatures and tactics in the arena. This after-school Pokémon class teaches the basic rules of the Pokémon Trading Card Game! Our young Pokémon trainers will get their own trainer decks to duel their friends. They will add new cards to their decks as they learn deeper strategies and the spirit of the game.

### Rainy Day Dinner Club: Weekly Dinner

(2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 10/Max 12)

Each week, students learn basic cooking skills while making dinner for their family! Students will create delicious dishes while focusing on the importance of local ingredients, scratch cooking, and natural preservatives while practicing knife skills and kitchen safety. Each entrée will serve 4 to 6 and will be packaged in oven-ready cookware with baking instructions. Please note that we offer vegetarian options upon request during registration. All our meals are nut free but for all other allergies or dietary restrictions please include these while registering. All meals must be refrigerated or cooked within 30-minutes of the class ending. **Note: Students attending an after-care program or leaving the food at room temperature past the 30-minutes run the risk of getting a foodborne illness.** Our Mission is to cultivate enthusiasm for cooking and build a positive culture around family meals! We use the perspective of food, cooking, and nutrition to learn about geography, math, science, and culture, while helping kids develop a life-long love of fresh ingredients and vegetables.

### Seattle Magic Academy: Discover Magic! Purple Wand Course

(2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 10/Max 20)

Get ready to take an amazing adventure into the exciting world of magic! Join the Seattle Magic Academy with their very popular magic class! Learn how to appear to read people's minds, make money appear out of nowhere, travel through time with a magic bandana, plus many more! This term is the "Purple Wand" course. The 4 different wand color courses offered can be taken in any order, and all the magic is different in each course. Students gain communication skills and self-confidence in these magic classes. Students will receive all the magic tricks taught in the course, "secret" file folders, access to an online video vault to revisit everything being taught, and more surprises!

### Stone Soup Theatre: Wizard of Oz

(2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade, Min 8/Max 14)
